State-Wide Assessments

- Stanford Achievement Test (SAT)
 - Grades
 - Kindergarten
 - 1st Grade
 - 2nd Grade
 - Subtests
 - Reading
 - Math
 - Test Administration
 - 2 days
 - Untimed

State-Wide Assessments

- Florida Standards Assessments (FSA)
 - Test Administration
 - All paper based assessments
 - Timed
 - ELA – Writing (4th & 5th Grade)
 - » 1 day
 - » 120 minutes
 - ELA Reading (3rd, 4th & 5th Grade)
 - » 2 days
 - » 80 minutes each day
 - Math (3rd, 4th & 5th Grade)
 - » 2 days
 - » 80 minutes each day

*Students will be given short stretch/water/restroom breaks during sessions

State-Wide Assessments

- FCAT 2.0 Science
 - Grade 5
 - Test Administration
 - Paper based assessment
 - Timed
 - 2 days
 - 80 minutes each day

*Students will be given short stretch/water/restroom breaks during sessions

Will there be Accommodations?

English Language Learners (ELL)

Students that are ELL

Levels I, II, III, or IV receive extended time

Exceptional Student Education (ESE)

Students who meet criteria for an exceptionality will receive accommodations as stated on their Individual Educational Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan

FSA Achievement Levels

- The success a student achieves on the Florida Standards will be assessed by FSA - ELA and Mathematics Assessments and is described by Achievement Levels that range from 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest).
- Level 3 indicates satisfactory performance

How are FSA Results Used?



Students who score at Levels **1** or **2** on the English Language Arts and/or Mathematics tests are required (**by state law**) to have intensive remedial assistance classes during the following school year

How are FSA Results Used?

Third Grade Promotion Requirements F.S.1008.25

- To be promoted to fourth grade, a third-grade student **must** score a Level 2 or above on the statewide FSA-ELA
- Demonstrate, through the Third Grade Portfolio Assessment, that he or she is performing at least at Level 2 on targeted standards
- Alternate Assessment as determined by the district

How are FSA Results Used?

5th Grade Students transitioning to Middle School

Students who score at Levels 1 or 2 on the English Language Arts and/or Mathematics tests are required (**by state law**) to have intensive remedial assistance classes during the following school year

- This intensive remediation is offered in place of an elective

CRE Implementation Plan

- Expectations
 - Every student will test
 - Per FLDOE, every student in grades 3 – 12 must participate in these assessments
 - MSO students will report to CRE for their assessments
 - All teachers will administer assessments to their own students
 - Arrival & Dismissal
 - Staggered Arrival Schedule for MSO (8:45 am – 9:00 am)
 - Students report **DIRECTLY** to their assigned Testing Room
 - MSO teachers will utilize Dojo, Remind, etc. to inform parents when testing has concluded
 - Driveline App used to dismiss students
 - Students will pivot to learning 30 minutes after being dismissed

CRE Implementation Plan

- Safety
 - CDC Guidelines Implemented
 - All students and staff MUST wear masks while on campus
 - Social Distancing is implemented at all times
 - Daily Assessments
 - One Grade Level tested per day
 - Exception
 - » 4th & 5th Grade ELA Reading & Math

CRE Implementation Plan

- Testing Rooms
 - Each MSO class will be assigned to one classroom to be utilized throughout duration of testing season
 - Each classroom will be sanitized prior to testing
 - Desks will be placed at a minimum of 3.3 ft apart
 - Students with accommodations will test in an alternate room (reducing the number of students in each testing room)
 - Every student will be provided with 2 – 3 sharpened pencils in a Ziploc to use throughout testing. Ziploc bag with pencils will remain in school so nothing is brought to and from home

Electronic Devices Reminder

- No electronic devices permitted during testing
 - Students **CANNOT** have any electronic device (e.g., cell phone, mp3 player, game system, etc.) on them **OR** within arm's reach even if they do not use them
 - **Cause for immediate invalidation of test**
